- b. Regular – an individual membership with voting rights.

4. Membership shall be established on payment of the appropriate dues by persons eligible for membership. Memberships are valid until the end of the calendar month occurring one year after purchase.”

“3. Classes of membership

(1) There shall be three classes of membership:

- a. Student – an individual membership with voting rights and who is engaged in a course of instruction at an accredited educational secondary or post-secondary institution in North America
- b. Regular – an individual membership with voting rights
- c. Lifetime – an individual membership with voting rights that is valid for the lifetime of the member and is non-transferable

Memberships are valid until the end of the calendar month occurring one year after purchase, with the exception of the Lifetime membership, which is valid for the lifetime of the holder and is non-transferable.”

***WildResearch President's Report 2013***

WildResearch has continued to grow in capacity and expand its programs this year. Now in its fourth year, WildResearch has 230 annual members and we have had to expand our administrative capacity by forming committees. In mid March, the Iona Island Operations Committee (OC) was formed to help with running WildResearch's Iona Island Bird Observatory (IIBO) in Richmond BC. In April and May, the OC built our new banding hut at the banding station, which was purchased with a grant from the Public Conservation Assistance Fund. If you haven't seen the new banding hut, drop by IIBO and take a look - it is very nice. In June WildResearch also formed the Membership Services Committee (MSC). Both committees are highly motivated and committed to their supporting role within WildResearch!

This spring WildResearch had great success with securing funding. In May, we received over \$12,000 from the Sitka Foundation to help fund IIBO for the next year and in June we received \$5300 from the Public Conservation Assistance Fund for use towards running our BC Nightjar surveys in 2014. Our Charitable Status application to the Canadian Revenue Agency has also been prepared submitted. Attaining Charitable Status is going to allow us to pursue many more funding sources- it will be a game changer.

Between 15 April and 31 May 2013, WildResearch conducted daily spring migration monitoring at Iona Island Bird Observatory. This spring an impressive 42 volunteers assisted with banding 2718 birds (2216 new birds and 474 recaptures). Special thanks to Dan Froehlich and Leena Tirrul for their efforts working as WildResearch's banders-in-charge this spring.

This summer, WildResearch conducted Nightjar surveys in the interior of BC for the third season. In May, we held a training workshop for the Nightjar Project in Oliver. There were a lot of motivated WildResearch volunteers in attendance, and they were all excited about getting involved and collecting data on nightjars. Despite uncooperative weather during the two survey periods, a total of 20 survey routes were assigned to volunteers this year for a total of 320kms to be surveyed across BC, as far west as Vancouver Island and as far east as the Kootenays.

WildResearch also contributed to the BC Butterfly Atlas project again this summer by co-hosting a BC Butterfly Atlas Training Workshop with the UBC Botanical Garden in June, organizing group butterfly surveys in Vancouver and Richmond

during May and August survey periods, and by attending Metro Vancouver's Butterfly Tea Party at Campbell Valley Regional Park in July.

WildResearch hosted its third Pelagic Seabird trip on Sept 15 for 96 participants from 4 provinces that joined the trip to sail to La Perouse Bank aboard the M.V. Francis Barkley. Highlights included Flesh-footed Shearwater, Manx Shearwater, and surprisingly, a Chestnut-sided Warbler! A special thanks to Pablo Jost, Russell Cannings, Mike Boyd, and Alan McKenzie for handling for logistics during the trip. Proceeds raised go towards running WildResearch's programs. The WildResearch board looks forward to offering the trip again next year.

This fall, WildResearch's IIBO fall migration monitoring program ran for 24 days between mid-Aug to the end-Oct. Forty-seven volunteers contributed 1093 volunteer hours to band 2339 birds (1981 new and 358 recaptured birds) of 48 species this fall. We also hosted banding demonstrations for BCIT's Conservation Biology class and two Girl Guide Units. A special thanks to Bander-in-Charge, Leena Tirrul, Director Paul Levesque, Volunteer Coordinator, Mikaela Davis, and all volunteers for their commitment to IIBO this fall.

Also this fall, WildResearch assisted Metro Vancouver with restoration work that involved planting 5000 native dune wildrye plugs at Iona Regional Park in areas where invasive Scotch Broom was removed. Thanks to the 17 members that helped with the planting and to Peter deKoning (Metro Vancouver), for inviting WildResearch to participate.

Looking forward into the winter, WildResearch will offer our membership events that include a Social Pub Night, Annual General Meeting, 4<sup>th</sup> Annual Volunteer Appreciation Party, Wildlife Identification Workshops, and a work party to prepare Iona Island Bird Observatory (IIBO) for the winter program. WildResearch members can stay informed about upcoming events by consulting their e-newsletter, which is prepared weekly by Director Elly Knight.

The WildResearch board is currently re-developing the website. Thanks to Director Kala Harris and web designer, Doug Avery, for their efforts in making the website more user friendly. We look forward to reaching a larger audience with the new website.

WildResearch Directors look forward to coming year and future opportunities to provide training opportunities and conservation projects to our dedicated membership. Thanks for a great 2013!

**Background**

The operations committee was created following a call from the Board of Directors in the Spring of 2013. The committee was formed with the goal of overseeing and organizing the maintenance, upkeep and improvement of the Iona Island Bird Observatory. We held our first meeting on March 28, 2013 and have had three subsequent meetings.

**Projects**

The committee has been tasked to conduct ongoing maintenance of the net lanes, trails and banding hut, maintain and track station equipment and organize volunteer work parties where needed.

The primary task completed by the committee in 2013 was the installation of the pre-fabricated Banding Hut. This occurred over three weekends in May. The hut is currently in use at the station and the committee has plans for continuing hut improvements (closet, shelves, signage, bird shoot).

The committee successfully organized a volunteer party in August to clear net lanes prior to banding; these work parties will be held prior to the spring and fall seasons annually.

Ongoing projects include:

- Generating a calendar of yearly events and tasks the committee will oversee/complete (work parties, meetings, funding proposal dates etc.)
- Finalizing a safety procedures manual
- Generating a list of best practices when using the banding hut
- Creating a yearly operating budget for the station
- Updating and troubleshooting the stations data management system
- Altering how the net poll supports are affixed to the ground so the net lanes can be mowed
- Completing construction of hut improvements.

Long term interest has been expressed to develop a vegetation monitoring protocol for the station and a funding proposal for the installation of a solar energy system for the banding hut.
